### A Note from the Rector



Dear friends,

On February 6, I will have served St. Luke's as your priest for seven years. Milestones like this one tend to lend themselves to reflection on the time that has passed. Here are a few of the things we have done in these seven years together:

- Installed the Eastport Memorial Labyrinth and instituted monthly group labyrinth walks.
- Refined and strengthened the operations of our weekly Food Pantry.
- Sponsored the education of a young woman in Uganda from secondary school to starting university.
- Participated in a four-way pulpit swap with St. Anne's, St. Margaret's, and St. Phillip's.
- Made our welcome of LGBTQ+ persons more explicit through rainbow flag symbols on our signs and website, flying the rainbow flag at certain times of the year, and partnering with Annapolis Pride to host events.
- Celebrated some of our long-time ministries as they came to an end, including the Easter Egg Hunt, Flea Market, and Spaghetti Suppers.
- Created St. Luke's Restoration of Nature, our four-acre watershed restoration and environmental education campus, which has dramatically increased our visibility in our local community and our diocese, and has even garnered attention from national organizations like Sojourners.
- Gradually increased my compensated ministry time from 25 hours per week to 35 hours per week.
- Ran a small, successful capital campaign called "Expanding Our Welcome" to install the awning over our lower level entrances, repair and paint the front porch, and create the wrap-around balcony as an accessible overlook to view the Restoration.
- Began sharing our worship services with the wider world through live-streaming them on our Facebook page.
- Engaged in the work of racial justice and reconciliation through book studies, discussions, and many members participating events like the diocesan workshop "Seeing the Face of God in Each Other."
- Benefitted from the compassionate ministry of Deacon Mary Walton for three years.
- Sponsored an individual for ordination to the priesthood for the first time in our parish's history.
- Served as an internship parish for another individual in the ordination process.
- Revived a Prayer Shawl knitting ministry.

- Launched the Children’s Sanctuary childcare program during worship on Sundays, laying the groundwork for offering Christian Formation to our youngest members.
- Participated in the launch of ACT (Anne Arundel Connecting Together), the first community organization of its kind in our county.
- Introduced a weekly Contemplative Prayer practice.
- Grew from an average of 35 people in worship on Sundays in 2012 to an average of 52 people in 2018.
- Welcomed 25 people into the church through baptism and celebrated 17 confirmations and receptions into the Episcopal Church.

This list only scratches the surface of all that our church does and all that it means to our members, our neighbors, and our communities. What other ministries, events, and moments would you include? I encourage you to share them with me, with the vestry, and with those around you, so we can remember and celebrate together.

## Vestry Highlights

For the past six months, the Vestry has been reading together a small booklet titled “Effective Organizing for Congregational Renewal” by the Metro Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF). This booklet is providing us with a fresh perspective on the importance of respecting, listening, and being in sincere relationship with one another. It begins with a quote from the great Dietrich Bonhoeffer: “The first service that one owes to others in the fellowship consists in listening to them... Those who cannot listen long and patiently will always be talking past others, and finally will no longer even notice it...The death of the spiritual life starts here... Brotherly

pastoral care is distinguished from preaching... by the obligation of listening.”

The booklet reminds us that in order to have meaningful relationship, we must see the face of Christ in one another. We must respect the time that others spend with us and recognize that a critical element of pastoral care is in listening whole-heartedly to what others share. There is a sacred space that opens between us when we are in true relationship, when we let God’s love infuse our words and thoughts. When the Spirit is at work in our relationships, then nothing can become stale and we are always in formation. If we are not changing and growing in the Spirit, then we are in a rut... or worse, in a grave.

This has been a helpful backdrop as we worked to plan our ministries, balance budgets, and prepare for the coming year. The past few months have provided opportunities for abstract envisioning and very practical planning. We created, reviewed, and approved the 2019 budget, which will be presented at the annual meeting. This wasn’t easy, mostly due to 2018’s maintenance expenses. As part of this, we agreed that the Sunday school childcare was an important initiative that needed to continue, so we applied to the Diocese for a grant to help subsidize the costs. We sought out new candidates who might be willing to serve on Vestry for the next three years. We started the “next stage” discernment process for our Restoration of Nature project. And we are well on our way with the Sabbatical planning process, which will provide opportunity for both Diana+ and our congregation to further discern and grow in our ministry.

2018 was a year of great joys and unexpected challenges. I expect 2019 will be the same and I hope for no less. I remain grateful to our Rector, the Vestry, and the congregation for your love, support, and the Spirit-infused relationship that we all share.

Would you be available to -


1. Drive members to doctor visits, grocery store or other appointments?

## "Are We There Yet?" Pilgrimage in the Season of Lent

Making a pilgrimage, or a sacred journey, is an ancient spiritual practice found in nearly every religious tradition and culture. This summer, Pastor Diana will be taking a pilgrimage to Iona as the centerpiece of her sabbatical, and she has encouraged us all to approach 2019 as a year of pilgrimage for our church community.

During Lent, we will begin reflecting more deeply on the idea of pilgrimage and what role it can play in our own lives. As a guide, we will be using a new booklet of daily readings called "Are We There Yet? Pilgrimage in the Season of Lent."

A series of forum presentations/conversations on Sundays during hospitality hour will explore different aspects of pilgrimage, including a presentation by Anne Arms on her recent pilgrimage to Israel/Palestine and a discussion of the labyrinth as a form of pilgrimage.

More details will be available in the March edition of the House Call and in our weekly enews. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 6 and continues until Easter Day on April 21.

## Holy Baptism

According to our *Book of Common Prayer*, the sacrament of Holy Baptism “is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ’s Body the Church” (pg. 298). In the Episcopal Church, people may be baptized at any age. For children and infants too young to speak for themselves, parents and godparents make promises on their behalf. Except for rare circumstances, baptism always takes place during a congregation’s primary worship service on a Sunday morning.

The next opportunities for Holy Baptism will be **Easter Day (April 21)** and the **Day of Pentecost (June 9)**. The **Easter Vigil service at 7 pm on April 20** is also a particularly suitable date for the baptism of adults. This is a joint service with St. Phillip’s Church and will be held at St. Luke’s this year.
